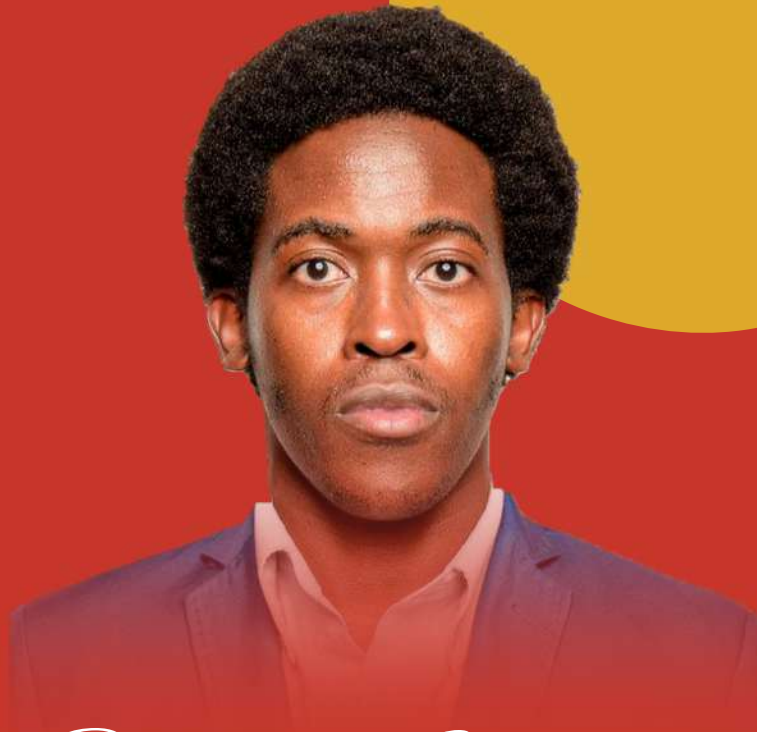

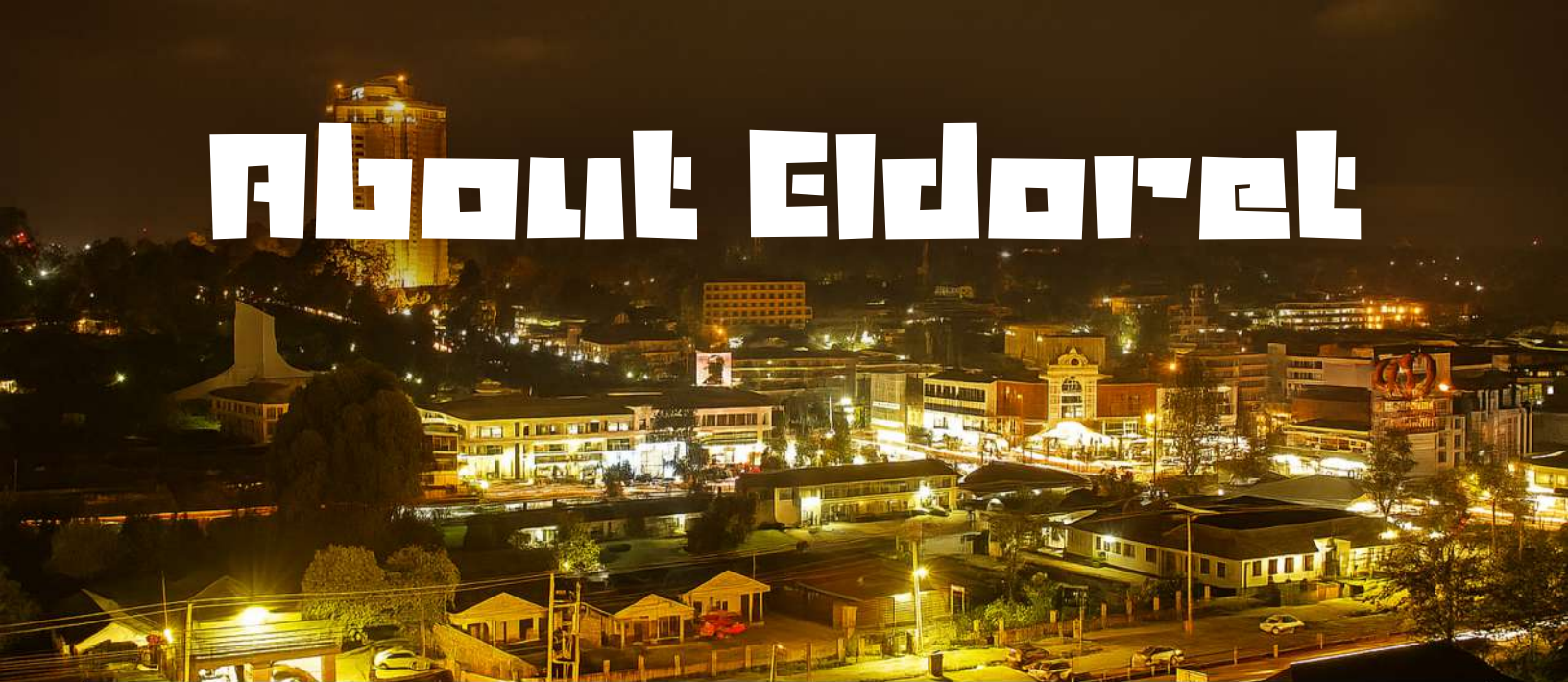

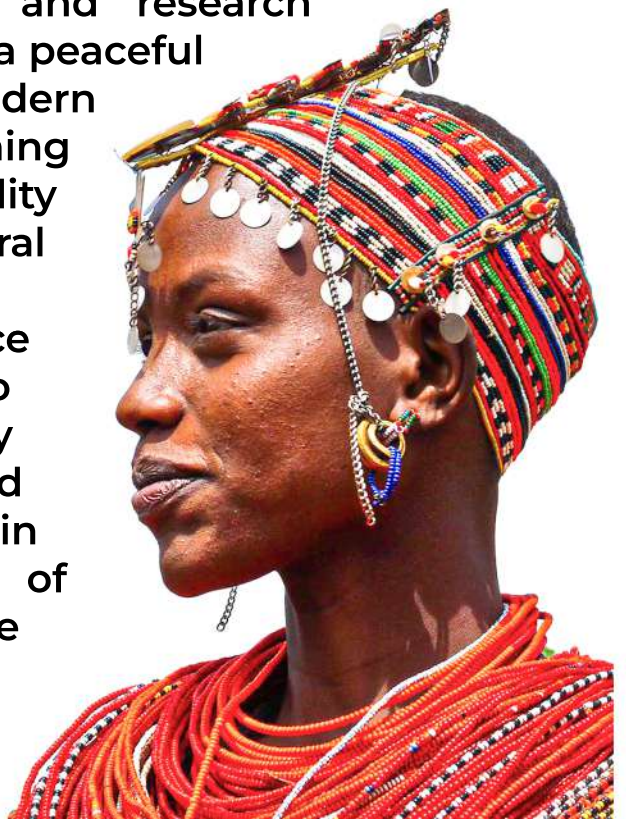
About Eldoret

The city is widely regarded as the 'City of Champions' owing to its reputation as the training ground for Kenya's elite long-distance runners. It also serves as a vital medical, educational, and commercial hub, hosting Moi University, MTRH, and various other tertiary institutions and research centers. Eldoret blends the charm of a peaceful countryside with the vibrancy of a modern city, offering visitors a safe, welcoming atmosphere, well-served by quality hotels, restaurants, and cultural experiences.

Kenya is a leading nation in East Africa, known for its dynamic economy, vibrant cultural diversity, and iconic natural landscapes. The country gained independence from British colonial rule in 1963 and is today a democratic republic with a devolved system of government. Its capital city, Nairobi, is a major regional and continental hub, hosting organizations such as the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and the UN-Habitat.

Kenya's population, estimated at around 55 million, is youthful, innovative, and increasingly urbanized. The economy is diversified, with strong performance in agriculture (tea, coffee, horticulture), financial services, telecommunications, tourism, and renewable energy. The mobile banking system M-PESA, a global innovation, was born in Kenya and reflects the country's leadership in digital inclusion.

The Kenyan healthcare system is decentralized and structured from community units to national referral hospitals. It is actively advancing toward Universal Health Coverage (UHC) through investments in digital health infrastructure, workforce development, and public-private partnerships. Kenya also plays a critical role in global health research and policy, with strong academic institutions and collaborations such as AMPATH and KEMRI-Wellcome Trust.

Tourism is a key pillar of the national identity and economy. Delegates may wish to explore the breathtaking Maasai Mara Game Reserve which is home to the Great Wildebeest Migration, the snow-capped Mount Kenya, and the pristine coastal beaches of Diani and Lamu. Other notable destinations include Lake Nakuru, Hell's Gate, and Nairobi National Park, the only wildlife reserve located within a capital city.

1. **English** – used in government, business, education, and law.
2. **Swahili (Kiswahili)** – the national language, widely spoken across the country and used as a unifying tongue.

Local Languages:

Kenya is home to over 42 ethnic languages, including Kikuyu, Luo, Kalenjin, Luhya, Maasai, Meru, Kamba etc.

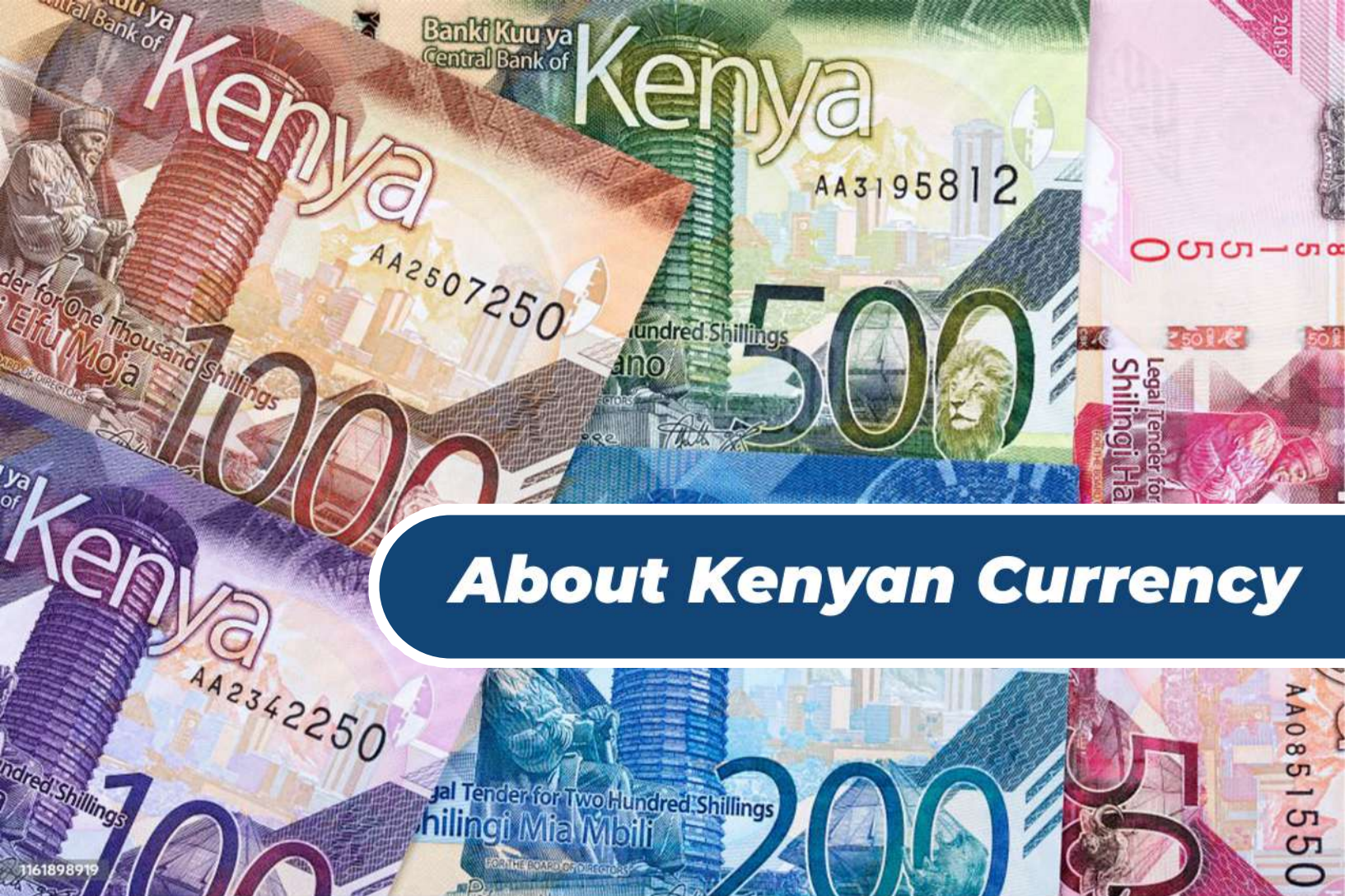
Kalenjin is the most widely spoken ethnic language in Eldoret. These are often spoken within communities but less commonly in formal settings.

Everyday Communication:

Most Kenyans are multilingual, often speaking their mother tongue (ethnic language), Kiswahili, and English.

Here's a list of 15 useful Swahili phrases for visitors in Kenya:

1. Jambo / Habari yako – Hello / How are you?
2. Niko salama/ Nzuri – I'm fine
3. Asante – Thank you.
4. Asante sana – Thank you very much.
5. Karibu – Welcome / You're welcome.
6. Pole / Pole sana – Sorry / Very sorry.
7. Tafadhali – Please.
8. Ndiyo / Hapana – Yes / No.
9. Bei gani? – How much is it?
10. Naomba msaada – Please help me.
11. Ninaelewa / Sielewi – I understand / I don't understand.
12. Unazungumza Kiingereza? – Do you speak English?
13. Choo kiko wapi? – Where is the toilet?
14. Nataka maji / chakula – I want water / food.
15. Kwaheri / Tutaonana baadaye – Goodbye / See you later.



The official currency of Kenya is the **Kenyan Shilling (KES)**, commonly denoted as KSh. It is subdivided into banknotes and coins, with banknotes available in denominations of 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1,000 Shillings, and coins ranging from 1 to 20 Shillings.

As of **August 2025**, the Kenyan Shilling trades at approximately KSh 128 to KSh 130 against 1 US Dollar (1 USD $\approx$ KSh 128–130).

Foreign currencies like the **US Dollar**, **Euro**, and **British Pound** can be exchanged at Kenya's banks, major airports, and licensed bureaux de change. In urban shopping centers, credit and debit cards are widely accepted, while **mobile money services** (e.g., M-Pesa) provide a secure and convenient alternative, especially in areas where card access is limited. Having cash at hand is useful if planning to explore the markets.

Automatic teller machines (ATMs) are available at several locations that are within walking distance from The Grand Empire Hotel accepting visa cards, including at Zion Mall which is only across the road. Other ATMs operated by some banks in the city center also operate on a 24-hour basis.

Kenyan Visa Requirements for FAMSA 2025 Delegates

All visitors to Kenya must obtain an *electronic travel authorization (eTA)* prior to travel unless they are citizens of one of the visa-exempt countries. As of January 2024, Kenya replaced traditional visa applications with an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) system for the majority of foreign nationals.

CATEGORY A: Visa-Exempt Countries

Nationals of select countries are exempt from obtaining an eTA and may enter Kenya without prior authorization for short stays. This includes nationals from:

1. East African Community (EAC) member states (e.g. Uganda, Tanzania, Rwanda, Burundi, South Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo)
2. Some Caribbean and Pacific nations
3. Other bilateral exemptions based on diplomatic agreements

CATEGORY B: All Other Countries

Nationals from countries not listed as visa-exempt are required to obtain an eTA prior to travel.

How to Apply for the Kenyan eTA

Step 1:

Visit the official eTA portal: www.etakenya.go.ke

Step 2:

Create an account, fill out the application form, and upload the necessary documents, which include:

1. A passport valid for at least six (6) months from the date of arrival with at least two blank pages
2. A recent passport-size photograph
3. A valid return or onward ticket
4. Proof of accommodation or invitation letter from the FAMSA 2025 Organizing Committee
5. Evidence of sufficient funds for the duration of stay

Step 3:

Pay the applicable eTA processing fee via the portal using a debit or credit card.

Step 4:

Await email confirmation. Successful applications typically receive the eTA within 3–5 business days, though earlier submission is advised.

Note: All delegates must print and carry a copy of the approved eTA to present at immigration control upon arrival in Kenya.

Special Cases: East African Nationals

Delegates from EAC countries may enter Kenya using a valid national passport or EAC e-passport without needing an eTA. However, they must still carry valid travel documentation and may be required to present an invitation letter for conference participation.

Kenyan Visa Fees

The eTA fee varies depending on the applicant's nationality but generally ranges between \$30–\$50 USD. You may check the specific fees on the official portal: www.etakenya.go.ke

A. PRE AND POST GA TRANSPORTATION

Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) is an international airport located in Nairobi, Kenya and serves as a major entry point into Kenya. Delegates can then use a connecting flight to Eldoret International Airport in Eldoret. All international delegates are strongly advised to travel through this airport. A logistics team will be available to receive you at the airport. Cars will be on the ground to transport you from the airport to the hotel. The journey is estimated to take about 30 minutes. A detailed transportation plan will be sent to each delegate after registration.

B. INDEPENDENT TRANSPORTATION

Delegates can travel down to Eldoret by road or air.

What is FAMSA GA 2025?

The Federation of African Medical Students' Associations' General Assembly (FAMSA GA) is the highest representative policy-making body of the Federation. The General Assembly serves as the annual meeting of African medical students under the umbrella of FAMSA. The FAMSA GA also hosts a scientific conference which includes plenary sessions, breakout sessions, oral and poster presentations, workshops, short courses, and training. The Conference welcomes students, healthcare professionals, policy makers, researchers, industry experts and enthusiasts from all over the world, to discuss tropical matters regarding global health and sustainable development.

Why should I attend this conference?

The mission of the conference is to inspire a generation of healthcare students and participants to take charge and play active roles in structuring the future of healthcare in Africa for sustainable development. By attending this conference, you are playing a key role in building a healthier and prosperous Africa. The networking opportunity this conference offers is amazing as top speakers from various organizations, and healthcare students from all over Africa are set to be in attendance. It is set to be a historical one!

How can French speaking delegates benefit maximally from this General Assembly and Scientific Conference?

Can I present my research work during the conference?

Yes, a call will be released for submission of abstracts.

Is the Scientific conference different from the General Assembly (GA)?

Yes, they are different. The General Assembly is the highest policy making body of the



Federation. This is where the activities of the Federation are reviewed with the rules of legislature, and the electoral gathering for the appointment of new executives of the Federation. It is at the General Assembly that the ongoing executive council are reviewed and dissolved, and another council elected in its place for another administrative year. Everyone can and should attend the Scientific Conference which includes plenary sessions, oral presentations, workshops, short courses, training and social events.

Can non-Africans attend the General Assembly?

Non-registered medical students' associations (MSAs) may wish to observe the assembly only and cannot participate. Only registered MSAs will be allowed to participate (that is, make contributions) in the FAMSA general assembly. During the electoral process, only the delegation appointed by appropriate authorities of the respective medical students' associations (Dean of faculty, association president or as according) can vote. The modalities for this meeting will be sent to MSA representatives before their arrival.

Can I pay my registration fee on arrival?

No, all delegates must register and pay before arriving at the venue. This is to ensure adequate logistics planning for delegates. To pay for the conference, kindly register, and follow the instructions in the reply mail. Also, check the registration page in this document for more details.
